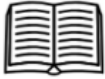
Guide someone who is limited in their verbal or reading abilities through a devotional.



Reinforce the video lesson and make a memory by picking an activity to do together!



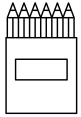
Listen to a Spotify playlist to set the tone in your home and reinforce the truths of the lesson.



Memorize scripture by viewing the verse video.



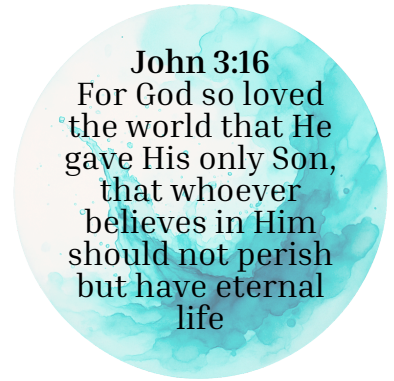
Be refreshed by the truths of Scripture throughout your day. Download a phone wallpaper.

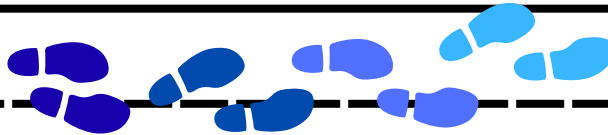

Lesson Recap



Just like a missing puzzle or Lego piece keeps a project from being complete, our lives feel incomplete because of sin. When God first created the world, everything—including our relationship with Him—was perfect. But sin entered and broke that perfection, separating us from God. Even though we try to be good, the Bible says everyone sins, and sin leads to death and separation from God (Romans 3:23, 6:23). Yet God had a plan to restore what was broken: He sent His Son, Jesus, the missing piece. Jesus lived a perfect life, took the punishment for our sins on the cross, died, and rose again—defeating death and offering us new life. When we believe in Jesus, ask for forgiveness, and follow Him, we are made right with God again. That's the good news we celebrate at Easter—Jesus is alive, and through Him, our relationship with God can be whole once more.

Habit Builder



Because God's plan has always been to redeem and restore His people through Jesus, we can build daily habits that remind us of that hope and help us live in light of His promises. Spend time each day reading God's Word to remember His story of redemption and to grow in faith. Pray regularly, thanking God for sending Jesus and asking Him to help you live in a way that reflects His love. Practice gratitude by noticing glimpses of God's goodness in the world around you, even in a fallen creation. Show kindness and forgiveness to others, remembering how much you have been forgiven. And finally, keep your eyes on eternity—remind yourself often that this world is not your final home, and that Jesus is coming again to make all things new. These habits help us walk daily in the joy and hope of being a new creation in Christ.
